THE SKY IS THE **LIMIT**

We have a simple, straightforward mission at the Dayton Development Coalition: To recruit, expand and retain jobs in the Dayton Region. When the year ends and we look back on our work, those three things show the growth of the region's economic base.



By those metrics, we had another exceptional year in 2023. Companies committed to create more than 5,200 new jobs and keep more than 5,800 jobs in our region. About a third of our projects were defense contractors establishing new operations or expanding in our community, helping to further diversify our economy. Those projects will generate more than \$383 million in new payroll and \$1 billion in capital investment. We continue to see new companies choose to establish operations in the Dayton Region, bringing new opportunities to our community.

We saw historic investments in the Dayton Region, Joby Aviation announced it will build an electric air taxi manufacturing facility, creating 2,000 new jobs.

When it comes to the eVTOL industry, our region's tagline has urged companies to, "Come here to test, stay here to build." Joby is doing exactly that. What started as a simulator at the Springfield-Beckley Municipal Airport will grow into aerospace manufacturing this

community has not seen in over 100 years. Their work to transform how we travel embodies the journey from flight invention to innovation.

The Dayton Region celebrated its first two Vibrant Communities Program designations in Camden and Urbana and saw more defense contractors establish operations in Downtown Dayton. Honda and LG Solution broke ground on their battery plant in Fayette County and the National Advanced Air Mobility Center of Excellence opened in Springfield. And Sierra Nevada Corporation broke ground on their second hangar at the Dayton International Airport.

Wright-Patterson AFB continues to have a significant impact on our region and its central role in the DOD's national imperatives puts our region in a strong position for growth. Wright-Patt is a strategic asset, and the Dayton Region has a track record of supporting our existing missions and attracting new ones. If we keep up our efforts, the outlook can be very bright.

No one economic development entity has the power to generate the momentum necessary to lift an entire region. None of this would have been possible without the commitment and collaboration of dozens of partners throughout the region, from city and county governments, to private economic development groups, chambers of commerce and utilities, and private industry. The collaborations and partnerships that define our community will continue to move us forward.

Thank you for all you do for the Dayton Region, and I look forward to the opportunities 2024 will bring.



Federal Policy and Administrative **Initiatives Supported:**

- > Authorizing \$19.5 million for planning and design of a long-needed building on Wright-Patterson AFB to house the acquisition workforce and conduct classified work.
- > Establishing the Great Lakes Mission Acceleration Center (one of only five MACs in the nation) to help small businesses and research organizations transfer technology to the Defense Department.
- > Including Congressional direction to strengthen the ongoing collaboration between the Air Force and Space Force through the Air Force Research Laboratory at Wright-Patterson.
- > Giving the National Space Intelligence Center (NSIC) at Wright-Patterson increased organizational authority within the Space Force.
- > Clarifying and expanding the authority of technology transfers between the Air Force Research Laboratory and industry and academic institutions and to help with workforce development.

JobsOhio PROJECTS

> Joby Aviation will build an electric air taxi manufacturing facility at the Dayton International Airport, creating 2,000 new jobs in the Miami Valley. Joby Ohio's new assembly-line manufacturing facility will build, test,

and fly allelectric, vertical take-off and landing (eVTOL) air taxis that will predominantly be used for commercial passenger operations. The aircraft, designed to accommodate a pilot and four passengers, will be capable of

achieving speeds of up to 200 miles per hour over a 100-mile range. The corporation plans to operate the aircraft as part of aerial ridesharing networks in cities and communities around the world.

- > The Dayton Region celebrated its first two Vibrant Communities Program designations in Camden and Urbana.
- > Defense contractor Diné Development Corporation, a Navajo Nation-owned corporation, announced it acquired 714 Monument Street in Dayton to establish a new facility in the city's Tech Town campus, dedicating the building to the Navajo Code Talkers. The project will create 100 new jobs and represents \$6.4 million in capital investment.
- > Resonant Sciences announced a strategic investment from an affiliate of Cerberus Capital Management, L.P., a global leader in alternative investing with a dedicated platform focused on supply chain integrity and national security. Resonant Sciences has grown to over 150 employees and operates in more than 100,000 square feet of engineering and manufacturing space in the Dayton Region, and will create an additional 225 jobs in the coming years. The company's team of engineers and subject-matter experts serve a customer base of commercial and government organizations spanning land, sea, air, and space domains.
- > Plastilene opened its first U.S. facility in June, cutting the ribbon on a new research and development center in Washington Court House. The Sustainable Food Packaging Innovation Center focuses on the development of recyclable food packaging that will help food producers reduce their carbon footprint and environmental impact. The \$47-million facility at the Rocktenn Building will create 58 new jobs and \$3.8 million in new payroll.
