

Dayton Art Institute Comprehensive Roofing Analysis


The Dayton Art Institute began the Historic Windows and Doors Rehabilitation project in August 2023 and will replace the Lower Court Doors, the Rotunda Main Entrance Doors, 31 Lower Gallery Windows, the Rike Administrative Entrance Doors, 33 Upper Windows 2nd Floor Parking Lot Side, the Lower-Level Stairway Doors, Main Loading Dock Doors, and the 36 Windows in the School Courtyard, all surrounding Curtain Wall, by the end of 2025. Funding sources include private donors, internal funding, as well as city (pending), county, state, and federal funds.


Focus must now turn to the roofs that ensure care of the art collection for future generations through the safekeeping of the art collection. The Dayton Art Institute engaged an engineering firm to complete a comprehensive roofing analysis. Roofing systems at the Dayton Art Institute include Rubber Roofs (EDPM), Copper Roofs, and Spanish Tiles. Overall picture of the Roofing Analysis is immediately below.



The total estimate, as of <u>9/1/2023</u>, for all identified roofing needs for the Dayton Art Institute is almost <u>\$3.3 Million</u>. The \$3.3 Million roof replacement costs are broken into three phases. Each phase of the project is \$1.1 Million. The three diagrams below depict the three phases of the Dayton Art Institute Roof Replacement Project.
